

## BOYS' STATE HISTORY

"To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation" is the purpose of The American Legion Boys' State, originated in 1935 by the Department of Illinois (department meaning 'state' in the Legion organization).

Kansas, holding Charter No. 5, was among the first to institute the week-long government-in-action training program. Within these past 30 years, virtually every state Legion, realizing the program's potential for educating youth in practical politics and governmental operation, has set up its own Boys' State.

Boys' State operates under the American Legion National Americanism Commission and is administered here by the executive committee of the Department of Kansas.


For 26 years, Kansas Boys' State was headquartered in Wichita. In 1963, in order to provide larger and more suitable accommodations, the Department moved State to the University of Kansas at Lawrence where it was housed in Templin and Lewis Halls, expanding the following session to include Hashinger Hall.

The program is no longer limited numerically by physical facilities but instead is available to any high school senior-to-be who meets the academic standards and demonstrates leadership qualities. The number of delegates has doubled since the move to Lawrence. Civic and church groups as well as Legion posts sponsor delegates.

Over 14,000 Kansas boys—the 1,015 delegates this year bringing the total to 14,416—have participated in Boys' State, performing during each session every function of government, on city, county and state levels.

Selected former Staters—100 of them—return as counselors to Boys' State and are assisted in its direction by 50 Legionnaire advisors and Executive Director Patrick J. Finley.

At the conclusion of each annual session, two Staters are elected "Senators" to attend The American Legion Boys' Nation, which convenes later in the summer in Washington, D.C. Kansas delegates to 1965 Boys' Nation are the gubernatorial candidates, Gov. John C. Peterson, Topeka, and David Nutt, the Nationalist candidate, Baldwin.




## GETTING SETTLED









Rules and procedures for elections were explained and discussed before we elected precinct committeemen Sunday night and caucused to formulate our state party platforms Monday morning. # CAMPAIGNS

Posters were hung from the ceilings with care—and plastered on the walls and the windows, too—as the primary races headed at a dead heat for the general election payoff.

City councils convened to meet and hear candidates for county offices, the senate and the house. State candidates addressed county meetings.

Whether we were running for county clerk or state senator, we each wanted to win. And it was every man for himself in the 24-hour-long primary campaign which ended with primary elections at 2:30 p.m., Tuesday.

We splashed our names across every available space—we used every play on words, every gimmick to make those names stick with the all-important voter.

We learned what it means, too, to remember names—to shake hands—to make a good impression when we spoke.

Perhaps most important, we learned that only one can win, but many must lose. And we who lost proved our mettle as good citizens by working for our party and our candidates and exercising our votes in the general election.


For as we left Tuesday night's general assembly, whether victorious or defeated, we united behind our party standard . . . vowing victory for our candidates, our declared platform goals.



# And MORE CAMPAIGNS



## PRIMARY RESULTS



James Rowe, director of Boys' Nation and guest of Kansas Boys' State during the two-day campaigning-election period, congratulated the winners of the 27-man primary gubernatorial race (center): J. David Nutt (I), Baldwin, Nationalist and John C. Peterson, Topeka, Federalist.



When primary election results were announced at Tuesday night's general assembly, Douglas K. Shryock, Wichita, Nationalist and Roger R. Robertson, Hutchinson, Federalist, had won their parties' nominations for lieutenant governor.

Declared winning candidates for secretary of state were Russell C. Leffel, Prairie Village, Nationalist and Greg H. Light, Derby, Federalist.

Nominated for the state treasurer spot were Randolph W. Starr, Hiawatha, Nationalist, and Robert F. Hartsook, Emporia, Federalist.

State printer candidates narrowed down to Ted M. Gardiner, Garden City, running on the Nationalist ticket and H. Paul Bledsoe, Strong City, Federalist.

Nominated to face each other in the general election for superintendent of public instruction were Steve Mercer, Eskridge, Nationalist, and Jim Rolf, Bison, Federalist.

Ronald Hastings, Council Grove, won the Nationalist nomination for commissioner of insurance and the Federalist bid went to Steve Stanley, Augusta.

Nominated for state auditor were Paul Christianson, Hutchinson, Nationalist and Bob F. Kingstone, Hoisington, Federalist.

Nationalists nominated John Kuhn, Hutchinson to bear their banner into the attorney general race, while Brad E. Schulenberg, Leavenworth, won the Federalist nomination.

Following the assembly, legislators met in party caucuses preceding the opening joint session of the legislature Thursday morning.



With a growing esprit de corps, "eyes right!" at the reviewing stand, we proudly marched our way each evening to city and county awards.






## MANHATTAN POPS AND TALENT SHOW


