

BOYS' STATE HISTORY

"To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation" is the purpose of The American Legion Boys' State, originated in 1935 by the Department of Illinois (Department meaning 'state' in the American Legion organization).

Kansas, holding charter number 5, was among the first to institute the week-long government-in-action training program. Within these past 30 years, virtually every state American Legion, realizing the program's potential for educating youth in practical politics and governmental operation, has set up its own Boys' State.

Boys' State operates under the American Legion National Americanism Commission and is administered here by the executive committee of the Department of Kansas.

For 26 years, Kansas Boys' State was headquartered in Wichita. In 1963, in order to provide larger and more suitable accommodations, the Department moved Boys' State to the University of Kansas at Lawrence where it was housed in Templin and Lewis Halls, expanding the following session to include Hashinger Hall, and in 1968 a portion of Ellsworth Hall was used.



The program is no longer limited by physical facilities but instead is available to any high school senior-to-be who meets the academic standards and demonstrates leadership qualities. The number of delegates has doubled since the move to Lawrence. Civic and church groups as well as American Legion posts sponsor delegates.

Over 22,000 Kansas boys — 900 delegates this year bringing the total to 22,994 — have participated in Boys' State, performing during each session every function of government, in city, county and state levels.

Selected former staters — 100 of them — return as counselors to Boys' State, and are assisted in its direction by 50 Legionnaire advisors and Executive Director, Grant Lane.

At the conclusion of each annual session, two Staters are elected 'Senators' to attend the American Legion Boys' Nation, which convenes later in the summer in Washington, D.C.



We checked out our packets, bought our two T-shirts, were fitted for hats; and then after we'd unpacked and settled in our rooms, we were full-fledged Staters at last.






CAMPAIGNS



Posters were hung from the ceilings with care—and plastered on the walls and the windows, too—as the primary races headed at a dead heat for the general election payoff.

City councils convened to meet and hear candidates for county offices, the senate and the house. State candidates addressed county meetings.

Whether we were running for county clerk or state senator, we each wanted to win. And it was every man for himself in the 24-hour-long primary campaign which ended with primary elections at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday.

We splashed out names across every available space—we used every play on words, every gimmick to make those names stick with the all-important voter.

We learned what it means, too, to remember names—to shake hands—to make a good impression when we spoke.


Perhaps most important, we learned that only one can win, but many must lose. And we who lost, proved our mettle as good citizens by working for our party and our candidates and exercising our votes in the general election.

For as we left Tuesday night's general assembly, whether victorious or defeated, we united behind our party standard...vowing victory for our candidates, our declared platform goals.

Roaring "two-bits, four-bits, six bits, a dollar" we hauled down our primary signs and began the big push behind our candidates for Wednesday's general election.

And MORE CAMPAIGNS

Both parties, the Federalists and Nationalists, campaigned for their party candidates. Each party chairman organized a vigorous campaign to win votes for their party.



PRIMARY RESULTS

Today the delegates to the American Legion Boys' State of Kansas selected party nominees for major state offices in a primary election at their annual government-in-action training program on the campus of the University of Kansas. Chosen by the Nationalist Party to head their list of candidates as governor was Jesse Milan while the Federalist picked Steve Cousins as their nominee for governor of Boys' State.

Voting in the primary culminated a tough battle for over 100 Staters competing for 18 positions on Wednesday's general election ballot. Other state candidates include the following:



This afternoon the delegates to the 36th annual American Legion Boys' State of Kansas elected Jesse Milan as governor of the government-in-action program being held on the University of Kansas campus. The long awaited announcement came at the evening assembly in Murphy Hall.

The Nationalist governor lives in Kansas City, Kansas with his parents Jesse and Alversa Milan and his two younger sisters and brother. Jesse, Jr. is a straight A student, member of the National Honor Society, and President of the National Forensics League at Washington High School. He has lettered in debate and won third place in a State Optimist Oratory Contest. He is a member of the school marching band and a capella choir. He is advisor to the Director of Youth of the Episcopal Church and Treasurer of the Human Relations Club. In his spare time, Jesse likes to play the piano and participate in dramatics and debate.



Our own Boys' State band piped us down the hill to "The Boys' State March", and we were entertained by the Boys' State chorus.







RETREAT With a growing esprit de corps "eyes right" at the reviewing stand, we proudly marched our way each evening to city and county awards.




TALENT SHOW
