## BOYS' STATE HISTORY

"To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation" is the purpose of the American Legion Boys' State program which was organized by the Department of Illinois in 1935.

The Department of Kansas, holding charter number 5, was among the first to institute this fine week-long government-in-action program. Now, virtually every state American Legion, realizing the program's potential for educating youth in practical politics and government operation, has set up its own Boys' State. Boys' State operates under the American Legion Department of Kansas and the Boys' State Committee.

Kansas Boys' State was headquartered in Wichita for 26 years before moving to its current base. In 1963, realizing the need to provide larger and more suitable accommodations, the American Legion moved the program to the University of Kansas campus in Lawrence. The first session was held in Templin and Lewis Halls but expanded to include Hashinger Hall in the second year of operations. A portion of Ellsworth Hall was used for the 1968 session when enrollment peaked at about 1,000 delegates.

No longer is the program limited by its physical facilities. It is available to any high school senior-to-be who meets the academic standards and demonstrates leadership qualities. Civic and Church groups as well as American Legion posts sponsor delegates to this fine "learning-by-doing" youth government program.

Over 42,000 young men from Kansas, 758 delegates this year alone, have participated in Boys' State performing every function of city, county, and state government. Selected former delegates, about 99 of them, return each year to serve as counselors. In addition, 35 legionnaires return to assist the counselors in running the program.

During each session two fortunate staters are chosen to represent Kansas as "Senators" of Boys Nation. The American Legion Boys Nation program convenes in Washington, D.C. in mid-July where they participate in a national government program as well as meeting with the Kansas congressional delegation.

The 51st Session of Boys' State began on Sunday, May 28, 1989. Staters began their day by registering in Templin Hall on the KU campus in Lawrence. The registration process went quickly and efficiently and the Staters were soon on their way with information packets containing their political party, city, county, and room assignments. After the presentation of the rules and elections, the Staters were ready for their first march to Murphy Hall.

The guest speaker for the evening assembly was Del Brinkman, Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs, who gave greeting to the Boys' State delegation.

The evening was concluded back in the halls. The Staters conducted their first city meeting by electing a mayor, the city council, and appointing other city officials. The Staters were now ready for their Boys' State experience.



# MONDAY



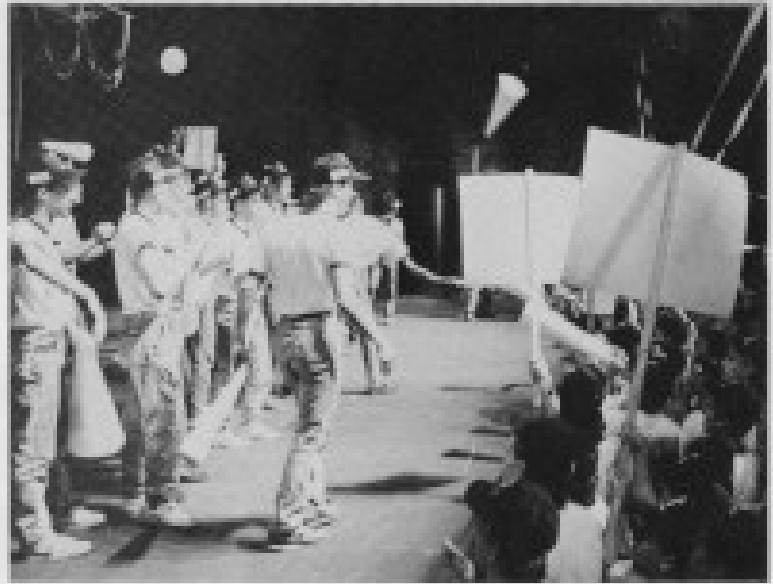
Basketball was one of the many sports offered to the Staters at Boys' State.

Memorial Day was started by honoring our country and flag, but the day quickly got into full-swing when city and county candidates for Governor were elected. Most of the day's events were centered around party caucuses, the placement of campaign materials, and listening to those Staters who were running for offices. The high point of the day came when 1988 Boys' State Governor Kepper Mullett swore in all of the newly elected Mayors.



Tuesday morning was spent preparing for and holding the Primary Elections. The Staters spent their afternoon at City Affairs, County meetings, and other activities. The whole day was spent building-up for the evening march to Murphy Hall.

Once at Murphy Hall, the Staters anxiously awaited the Primary results. With the Nationalist and Federalist candidates announced the Party Rallies began. The Federalist and the Nationalist separately took the stage for 10 minutes each for party rallying and cheering. The rallies gave each candidate a chance to be recognized before the elections and for the key note both governor candidates were from King County. The evening's guests were Attorney General Robert Stephan and State Treasurer Joan Pinney both discussing Legislature and Democracy.



The Party Rallies were filled with enthusiasm and both sides made Murphy Hall echo with rally cheers.
