BOYS' STATE HISTORY

"To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation" is the purpose of the American Legion Boys' State program which was organized by the Department of Illinois in 1935.

The Department of Kansas, holding charter number five, was among the first to institute this week-long government-in-action program. Now, virtually every state American Legion, realizing the programs potential for educating youth in practical politics and government operation, has set up its own Boys' State. Boys' State operates under the American Legion Department of Kansas and the Boys' State Committee.

Kansas Boys' State was headquartered in Wichita for twenty-six years before moving to its current home in Lawrence. The American Legion moved the program to the University of Kansas campus in 1963. At KU, the first session was held in Templin and Lewis Halls but expanded to include Hashinger Hall in the second year.

The Boys' State program is available to any high school senior-to-be who meets the academic standards and demonstrates leadership qualities. Civic and church groups as well as American Legion posts sponsor delegates to this fine "learning-by-doing" youth government program.

Over 42,000 young men from Kansas, 739 delegates this year alone, have participated in Boys' State performing every function of city, county, and state government. Approximately 80 former delegates return each year to serve as counselors. In addition, 40 legionnaires return to assist the counselors in running the program.

During each session two staters are chosen to represent Kansas as "senators" of Boys' Nation. The American Legion Boys' Nation program convenes in Washington, D.C. in mid-July where they participate in a national government program.

The fifty-third session of Boys' State began on Sunday, May 27, 1990. To begin, staters registered in Lewis Hall. During registration, information packets containing their political party, city, county, and room assignments were distributed. After the presentation of the rules and elections, the staters were ready for their first march to Murphy Hall.

The guest speaker for the evening assembly was former Secretary of State Jack Brier who spoke on the need for involvement in government.

The evening was concluded back in the halls. The staters conducted their first city meeting by electing a mayor, the city council, and appointing other city officials. The staters were now ready for their Boys' State experience.

WEDNESDAY

Wednesday was general election day. The morning began with the staters marching to Murphy Hall to hear the primary election winners debate. Debates were wild and rowdy and there were many questions about party platforms. The general elections that day would decide the fate of both parties.

In the afternoon, the general election results were announced. The 1990 Boys' State Governor and Lt. Governor were Kyle Kimball and Matt Jordan.

At the evening assembly, former Boys' State Governor, Ajti Pai swore in Kimball and Jordan. After his inauguration, Governor Kimball swore in the rest of the 1990 officials. Former Governor John Carlin and special guest 'Dwight D. Eisenhower' spoke to the staters.

After the assembly, some staters concluded the evening by working in their newly elected and appointed offices while other staters continued working on city and county ordinances and government problems.

All the government branches were in full operation. The Boys' State Supreme Court went to Topeka to visit the Kansas



Supreme Court. Sergeant Steve Jensen took the Boys' State Highway Patrol to the Kansas Correctional



Institution and the Kansas Highway Patrol headquarter in Topeka. Governor Kimball addressed a joint session of the legislature.

Each of the nine counties of State nominated a Boys Nation candidate. Each candidate gave a speech at the evening assembly in Murphy Hall. Of these nine candidates, two were elected by popular vote to go to Washington D.C. in July for Boys Nation.

Legionnaire and advisor Grant Lane introduced the newly elected Kansas Department Commander Bill Angell.



The highlight of the evening was the Talent Show. The talent show allowed the staters to show their many talents. The Boys' State Band and Choir were the first to perform. After the band and choir, comedy skits, vocal songs, and classical and original piano scores of music were performed, the Talent Show concluded with one of the funniest skits ever—the county counselor's skit.



FRIDAY

On Friday, all government branches brought the 1990 session of Boys' State to an end. In the morning, Outstanding Citizens and Boys Nation representatives were elected. The Outstanding Citizens were chosen by their cities while the Nation representatives were voted on by the staters. The Boys Nation candidates were Tu Dao and Chad Bryan both of Wichita, Kansas.

In the evening, the Statesmen's Club rewarded the Governor and the staters for the week's hard work with the Inaugural Celebration. This celebration consisted of a dance and two feature movies.

In many minds, the memory of marching, city meetings, and campaigns were present and the importance of State in a general sense was realized. Yet, the events of the final day, Saturday, were to remind the staters of this importance and perhaps to shine a new light upon the past week for many of the young men.

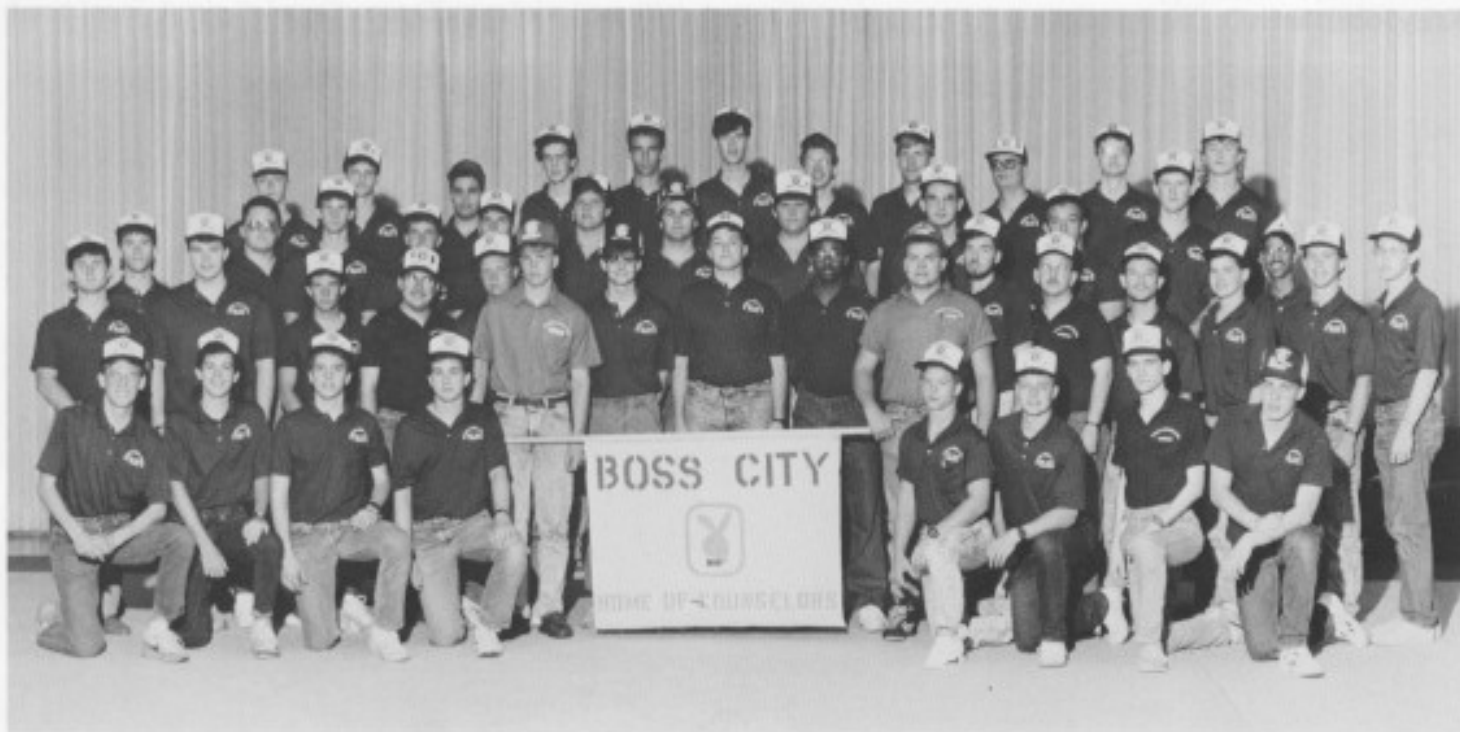
