An Overview of Boys' State...

"To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation" is the purpose of the American Legion Boys' State program. The first Boys' State was organized by Hayes Kennedy and Harold L. Card of the Department of Illinois in 1933.

The Department of Kansas, holding charter number five, was among the first to institute this week long government-in-action program. Now, nearly every state American Legion, realizing the program's potential for educating youth in practical politics and government operation, has set up its own Boys' State.

The American Legion Boys' State of Kansas was headquartered in Wichita until 1963 when the program was moved to Lawrence and the campus of the University of Kansas. In 1992, Boys' State moved to Kansas State University in Manhattan. The office has been

moved into the American Legion Department Headquarters in Topeka.

Boys' State is open to any male high school senior-to-be who meets the academic standards and demonstrates leadership qualities. Many Legion Posts as well as Civic and Church groups and individuals sponsor delegates each year.

Nearly 700 delegates from this session join the over 44,000 young men of Kansas as alumni of Boys' State. Each year past Staters return to help the next group of delegates as counselors. In addition, past counselors and Legion members give up a week of their summer to help as Advisors to the Staters.

During each session, two Staters are chosen by their peers to represent Kansas as Senators at Boys Nation. Convening in Washington, D.C., in mid-July, Boys Nation gives the Senators a chance to form and run a government on the national level.

Sunday...

The 36th session of The American Legion Boys' State of Kansas began with registration of the Kansas State University campus in Manhattan. This session marked the return of Boys' State for a second year to K-State.

This year's delegates and parents sped through the registration process and received information concerning the delegates' political parties, room, city and county assignments. As the day progressed the sense of excitement grew as each Stoner began to sense that they would soon be on their own to create their very own working government.

Once settled, Stoners became acquainted with the other citizens of their cities and started establishing their city governments.

Greetings from Kansas State University and from Boys' State opened the first evening assembly. Guest speaker and advisor, Thane Chastain of North Newton, spoke to the delegates about three important lessons that he had learned from events in his life. First, that life truly is worth living. Secondly that no matter what, we shouldn't give up. And perhaps most importantly, we shouldn't take ourselves too seriously.

Monday...

The first full day of Boys' State saw the Nationalists and Federalists formulate their platforms in party conventions.

Each Stater got a chance to file for a City, County or State office. Immediately after the filing deadlines, campaign materials were everywhere. Each candidate searched for that unique way of getting his message across to the voters. Business cards, posters, paper plates and a number of other unusual mediums were employed by the candidates.

Governor Dale Derrell administered the oath of office to the leaders of each city during the evening assembly. American Legion representatives presented information to the Staters about their numerous programs and scholarships that are available to the youth of Kansas.

Staters then turned their attentions to determining the major platform planks that would be the basis of their campaigns. Ultimately, the work done in conventions showed up in their State government.

Tuesday...

Shortly after breakfast, primary election winners were announced. The Staters returned to their County areas for "rap" sessions.

Turning once again to their government projects, the Staters tried to solve the problems associated with unemployment during a recession. Primary elections for the Federalist and Nationalist parties were held after a final appeal by candidates.

Staters marched to McCain Auditorium for the evening assembly. Primary election winners competed in issue-oriented debates before the Staters voted in the General Election.


Wednesday...

The results of the General Election are announced and the State Office holders assume their duties. Nationalists and newly elected Governor Ian Sotomayor and Lieutenant Governor Trevor Dennis were joined in running the State by Secretary of State Wade Bacon, Attorney General Spencer Gardner, State Treasurer Travis Trexler and Commissioner of Insurance Chris Holt, all of whom were Federalists.

Once all office holders took their respective oaths, the business of running a new government got into full swing. Numerous appointed offices were filled. The Senate and the House of Representatives, both controlled by the Federalist Party, opened their sessions and immediately went about the business of balancing a shrinking state budget.


The evening assembly featured the annual Boys' State Talent Show. Performances included instrumental arrangements, one act plays, comedy skits and a variety of excellent singers.

But, the work of the day was not yet over. Each county still needed to select one delegate to run for the two coveted positions of Senator to Boys' Nation.

Even the County Counselors get into the act with a sample of the work at Boys' State...as seen through their blury eyes.




Thursday...

The second full day of State government got under way with the Legislature and Supreme Court both in session. Governor Sotomayor held his first press conference.

Governor Sotomayor outlined his plan to overhaul the Boys' State economy and put people back to work. The Supreme Court heard a libel case involving a Letter to the Editor that had been printed in the States' Union, the official newspaper of Boys' State.

The evening assembly opened with performances by the Boys' State Band and Boys' State Chorus. The house was rockin' to the tune of *Leave, Leave*.
